What is Dual Enrollment?

Acceleration Program:

- Access to rigorous courses
- Credits count toward HS diploma & the college degree simultaneously
- No tuition/fees for eligible students

At FSU, dual enrollment courses are EXCLUSIVELY in person and on the FSU campus /max of 9 credits per term / max of 30 attempted credits.

Is Dual Enrollment Really Free?

Ideally ~ \$0

No tuition/fees ~ No charge for books/materials

Student Responsibility:

- Transportation to campus
- Fines: parking tix, late library books, lost ID card
- Consumable supplies (e.g., paper, pens)

FSU Dual Enrollment Eligibility Requirements



- Eligible HS or home education (in Leon/Wakulla/Gadsden)
 - Leon Co. High Schools, Wakulla HS, Gadsden Co. HS
 - Florida High
 - Registered home education w/ Leon, Wakulla, or Gadsden school district
- 3.9 or higher Overall Cum HS GPA (weighted) & no HS semester grades below "C"
- Min. of 12 HS credits by end of Fall '26, including:
 - 2 English + 2 math w/ Algebra II + 1 science w/ lab + 1 social science

FSU Dual Enrollment Eligibility Requirements: Continued

- ACT min = 26 or CLT min = 86 or SAT min = 1230
 - Plus all sub-score minimums (see website)
 - Last eligible tests: **Oct. 17 ACT** or **Oct. 29 CLT** or **Oct. 3 SAT**
- 3.0 FSU GPA to re-apply for future terms

Cautions Regarding Dual Enrollment

1. Grades go on HS & college transcripts – will impact future college applications.
2. Non-degree seeking status (at FSU)
 1. Does not require a major or necessarily give access to courses in a major of interest
 2. Does not provide access to an AA degree in HS
3. Participation is only for one term
 1. Must reapply every semester
 2. Does NOT guarantee admission to FSU after HS

Dual Enrollment Course Policies

- Students who qualify for High School Dual Enrollment (HSDE) at FSU will choose from the courses listed under the “General Education” area on the [CoreFSU “Find a CoreFSU Course” webpage](#).
- A course listed under CoreFSU does not constitute a promise of seat availability at the time of registration. Please note that course offerings also vary by semester, so check Schedule Assistant for availability in a given term.
- HSDE students may discuss other course options with their academic advisor, it is advised to select alternate courses in preparation for the registration meeting.
- **Dual enrollment students are non degree-seeking at FSU. While general education courses remain the foundation of dual enrollment coursework, approved upper-division courses in mathematics, computer science, and foreign languages may also be available.**

Dual Enrollment Course Policies: Continued



Dual enrollment students may not take the following types of courses designated as excluded:

1. Physical education, recreation, or leisure courses
2. Any course offered for fewer than 3 credits, graded on S/U basis, or offered as directed individual study (DIS)
3. Any course for which the student has not completed the prerequisite(s) established by the academic department
4. Any course for which a student has already earned or anticipates earning college credit (e.g., AP, IB, AICE, CLEP, or dual enrollment) or any course below a student's current level of proficiency based on a placement test (e.g., math and modern languages)
5. Specialized admission, limited availability, honors, or major-restricted courses.
6. 4000-level courses
7. Online courses
8. Other specialized courses designated as excluded from course offerings by FSU or the Florida Department of Education and communicated to students and school counselors at the time of course registration

FSU Dual Enrollment Student Expectations



1. Read the HSDE Student & Family Guide
2. Attend ALL classes (unless documented reason)
3. Adjust study habits to a research university
4. Notify ACE if concerned about a class/grade
- 5. Check FSU email daily after it is set up**
6. Read Academic Honor Policy & Conduct Code

FSU Dual Enrollment Family Expectations



1. Read the HSDE Student & Family Guide
2. Do not ask for or use your student's FSU login & password (compromises academic integrity)
 - Only students have access to instructor gradebooks during the semester.
3. FSU transcript will be mailed to the HS at end of semester
 - Students can check final grades & unofficial transcript online (official must be requested from Registrar)

What's Next for Dual Enrollment Students: FSU

Steps One and Two

1. First obtain initial approval to participate

- **Gadsden, Leon, and Wakulla HS students:** meet with your high school counselor who will complete the approval form, send to ACE, and give you the student application password
- **Home education students in Leon, Wakulla, Gadsden:** email your home education registration form & eligible ACT or SAT score to ace@fsu.edu. ACE will verify & share the student application password

2. Submit HSDE Online Application (ACE website)

- All required documents must be submitted by the deadline:
Friday, November 13 at 5:00pm
- New students only: health history & immunization form

What's Next for Dual Enrollment Students: Steps Three and Four

3. Eligible Apps Processed / Next Steps

- Look for Registrar email at your personal email account – new students must activate FSUID & login and set up your FSU email account
- Check your FSU email for an invitation to the Canvas Dual Enrollment Orientation module – new students will receive an email by early Nov. to complete before advising/registration
- Look for email from ACE at your FSU email account – to schedule advising appointment.

4. Use Schedule Assistant to Prep for Advising

- Search for courses approved by school counselor
- Put courses in your shopping cart and stop there (you will NOT be able to register yourself)

What's Next for Dual Enrollment Students: Step Five



5. Complete Virtual Advising Appointment w/ ACE (November 16 – December 4)

- ACE will review courses in shopping cart with you
- ACE will enroll you in courses

RELEVANT DATES FOR PROSPECTIVE DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS	
October 3	<i>Last possible date to take the SAT test for HSDE at FSU in Spring 2027.</i>
October 17	<i>Last possible date to take the CLT test for HSDE at FSU in Spring 2027.</i>
October 29	<i>Last possible date to take the ACT test for HSDE at FSU in Spring 2027.</i>
October 5 - November 3	Students must meet with HS counselor for approval. School counselors will submit the online approval form to ACE and provide students with the HSDE Online Application password.
October 12	The online HSDE Student Application opens on the ACE website .
October 21	4:00pm Virtual Information Session for students/families - signup to be linked soon.
November 5	4:00pm Virtual Information Session for students/families - signup to be linked soon.
November 13	5pm Deadline to submit HSDE Online Application to FSU for <i>Spring 2027</i> (ALL NEW AND RETURNING HSDE students). Incomplete applications will be denied.
November 6	Online academic advising begins for Spring 2027.
December 4	Advising and HSDE course registration for Spring 2027 closes at noon.
